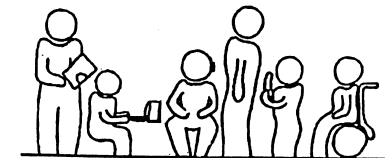

*Treatment Considerations for Children

Recently, it seems as though there has been an increase in the number of children identified with ‘speech concerns’ that extend beyond the typical stopping, fronting, and cluster reduction patterns we’re used to seeing. As such, there is a need for greater collaboration between the speech pathologist and the communicative disorders assistant in an attempt to maximize services in, what is often, an already time, resource and knowledge limited domain. This presentation will review the Early Signs of a social communication delay, often apparent between 12-18 months of age. You will be challenged to find ways to work together with other professionals in your community (SLPs, physiotherapists, public health nurses, teachers, etc.), to offer early intervention services that will alter outcomes for these toddlers. CDAs working in school boards will also find this information useful to present to their team to help families with infant/toddler siblings.
